# Accessing Library Resources from Google Scholar http://google.com/scholar

STEP 1: Tell Google Scholar you are affiliated with Erikson
[If on campus, this step is not necessary because you are on the campus network]
Access <b>'Settings'</b> at the top left of the main Google Scholar page.
It's the three lines that look like this:
Then click <b>'Library Links'</b> .
Search for <b>"Erikson Institute"</b> and click SAVE.
STEP 2: Search for Articles
Type your article or topic into the search box. You don't need the entire title
the first few words and possibly the author's last name if you know it.
